

From the desk of Secretary

"As we come close to end of our term, we bring to you this sixth newsletter on behalf of executive committee of GSI. This period of two years has been full of excitement, fulfilment, and learning for me. Dr B K Nayak, our president, has been a great mentor checking every detail personally to the most minute level. With a treasurer as cooperative as Dr Maneesh Singh and a great executive



body team, we could achieve most of the tasks that we had planned to do. The most challenging task that was assigned to the current executive was to have the society statuary compliant. We have submitted approximately 600 pages of documents with the registrar's office and are in the process of submitting additional documents as per their further demand.
